Here are some ways your dollars help children and adults in our community

What Your Gift of \$1/Week, Equivalent to a Lottery Ticket Provides

- Three new life jackets or a week's supply of sunscreen for kids with disabilities to use at Camp Columbus
- Pain management to one Hospice patient for up to 2 weeks
- 360lbs of food for pantry distribution
- One week of before or after school child care for 1 child at the YMCA
- Emergency accommodations for 4 following a single family home fire
- One hour of counseling support and education to individuals with hearing or visual impairments

What Your Gift of \$2/Week, Equivalent to a Latte Provides

- Pantry supplies for a family of three for 4 months
- One week of supplies for Chapel House homeless shelter operations
- 2 elementary students in Cayuga County with the CHAD Agency's Substance Abuse Prevention Program at their school.
- Oxygen for one Hospice patient for 1 month
- 2 runaway/homeless youth with interventions, safety plans and reunification with family

What Your Gift of \$5/Week, Equivalent to a Fast Food Breakfast Provides

- Weekly counseling sessions for one year at the CHAD Agency's Substance Abuse Clinic
- Provides 44 round trips per week for a senior or disabled individual via the SCAT VAN
- 4 weeks of Freedom Camp for a non-disabled sibling to attend camp with their disabled brother or sister
- A week with a one-on-one summer camp coach for a child with Autism
- After school transportation to 15 youth to Booker T. Washington Community Center for entire program year
- 7 emergency motel lodgings for a family of 4

What Your Gift of \$10/Week, Equivalent to a Lunch at Your Favorite Restaurant Provides

- After-care case management for one individual to assist them with transitioning from homelessness to housing for a 3 month period
- Pantry supplies for 3 families of 3 for one year
- 40 girls with a one year Girl Scout membership
- Sends 2 children to summer camp for two weeks
- Pain management to one Hospice patient for a month
